



Consideration of Approval of the City of Plano's Heritage Commission Recommendations for the 2023 Heritage Tax Exemption Program

RECOMMENDATION:

The District President recommends approval of the Heritage Commission recommendations for the City of Plano's 2023 Heritage Tax Exemption program.

RATIONALE:

The City of Plano's purpose for the Heritage Tax Exemption program is to incentivize maintenance of historic properties in a manner that reflects significance to the community. As an overlapping taxing jurisdiction, the College has traditionally approved the exemptions to support the program and maintain the same tax base for a property across taxing jurisdictions.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-2-3

An Ordinance of the City of Plano, Texas, providing certain Heritage Resources within the City of Plano ad valorem tax relief as allowed by the Heritage Tax Exemption Ordinance to provide for reinvestment into maintenance and long-term preservation of historic structures, providing a severability clause, and an effective date.

WHEREAS, Article 8, Section 1-F of the Texas Constitution and the Texas Tax Code, Section 11.24, enable the City of Plano to exempt from taxation part or all of the assessed value of a structure if the structure is designated as a historically or archeologically significant site in need of tax relief to encourage its preservation; and

WHEREAS, City of Plano Ordinance No. 2022-8-14, also known as the Heritage Tax Exemption Ordinance, authorizes the City Council of the City of Plano, upon certification and recommendation by the Heritage Preservation Officer, or granting of an appeal, extension, or waiver by the Heritage Commission, to exempt from the current year taxation part or all of the assessed value of a structure if the structure is designated as a historically significant site and in need of tax relief to encourage its preservation; and

WHEREAS, in March 2022, property owners were sent the results of their 2022 annual inspection with a deadline of January 1, 2023, for completing any necessary repairs and additional information on the process, including appeals and extensions; and

WHEREAS, in November 2022, property owners were sent a reminder of the January 1, 2023, deadline for completing necessary repairs and information regarding the appeals and extension process eligible through the Heritage Commission; and

WHEREAS, on December 6, 2022, reminder postcards were sent to participating property owners informing them of the deadline to complete required repairs and upcoming inspections; and

WHEREAS, on January 3, 2023, inspections were carried out in accordance with the Heritage Tax Exemption Ordinance allowing the Heritage Preservation Officer to certify and recommend 82 properties for approval of ad valorem tax relief for 2023 as more specifically described in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, on January 6, 2023, in accordance with the Heritage Tax Exemption Ordinance, notice was sent via certified mail to five properties deemed ineligible for program participation and informing them of their right to appeal or request an extension to the Heritage Commission; and

WHEREAS, four appeals or extension requests were received for the properties at 901 17th Street, 907 17th Street, 910 18th Street, and 920 18th Street; and

- **WHEREAS**, on February 7, 2023, a one-year extension for the deadline to complete necessary repairs was considered and granted by the Heritage Commission for the properties at 901 17th Street and 920 18th Street; and
- **WHEREAS,** on February 7, 2023, an appeal related to exterior work completed without approval of a Certificate of Appropriateness was considered and granted by the Heritage Commission for the property at 907 17th Street; and
- **WHEREAS,** on February 7, 2023, a one-year extension for the deadline to complete necessary repairs was considered and, in lieu of an extension, a waiver was granted by the Heritage Commission for the property at 910 18th Street; and
- **WHEREAS,** on February 27, 2023, the City Council reviewed the properties recommended for 2023 Heritage Tax Exemption approval as listed in Exhibit A; and
- **WHEREAS,** the City Council finds that the structures listed in Exhibit A to this ordinance have been certified and recommended by the Heritage Preservation Officer, or granted an appeal, extension, or waiver by the Heritage Commission, are to be approved based upon the agreement noted herein, and thus should be approved for ad valorem tax relief for 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLANO, TEXAS, THAT:

- **Section I.** The historic structures identified in the attached Exhibit A are hereby approved by the City Council for tax exemptions for the current year (2023) consistent with the relief indicated in the attached exhibit and in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 2022-8-14.
- **Section II.** All land shall be assessed for taxation in the same equal and uniform manner as all other taxable property in the City.
- **Section III.** It is the intention of the City Council that this ordinance and every provision hereof shall be considered severable and the invalidity or partial invalidity of any section, clause, or provision of this ordinance should not affect the validity of any other portion of this ordinance.
- **Section IV.** This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage as required by law.

Dear Ms. Irby:

The Plano City Council has approved partial tax exemptions for 86 properties and denied partial tax exemption for one (1) property within the City of Plano for the 2023 Heritage Tax Exemption program. Please schedule a review of the recommended tax exemptions for an upcoming meeting of the Collin College Board. Timing is important and the list of exempted properties must be forwarded to the Collin Central Appraisal District as soon as possible.

The purpose of heritage tax exemption is to incentivize maintenance of historic properties in a manner that reflects significance to the community. In accordance with the Heritage Tax Exemption Ordinance, Planning staff conducts an annual survey of all properties requesting a tax exemption to ensure that proper maintenance and upkeep are occurring. The tax exemptions apply only to the value of "improvements" to the property (historic buildings, accessory buildings, fencing, etc.), not to the land value. The exemption rates and property categories are noted below:

Class	Property Category	Exemption Rate
Α	Heritage Landmark - Residential Use	100%
В	Heritage Landmark - Non-Residential Use	50%
С	Contributing or Compatible Structure - Residential Use	75%
D	Contributing or Compatible Structure - Non-Residential Use	38%

I have attached a copy of the approved Ordinance No. 2023-2-3 listing properties approved for tax exemption (Exhibit A) for 2023. Exhibit A summarizes the properties recommended for approval and includes information such as exemption percentage applied, property improvement values, and estimated tax exemption values for the Collin College portion. Please note since 2023 appraised values have not been established and the 2023 property tax rate has not been set, the actual value of these exemptions will be determined by the Collin Central Appraisal District in September 2023.

The Heritage Commission and Plano's historic preservation program relies heavily upon this tax exemption program. Your contribution helps the City continue to offer valuable incentives for preservation of our irreplaceable resources. Please inform me of the results of the meeting so that I may forward the information to the Collin Central Appraisal District.

RECOMMENDATION

The District President recommends approval of the proposed Academic Calendar for the 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 Academic Terms.

RATIONALE

The Academic Calendar is developed and reviewed by the College Calendar Committee, with representatives from Faculty, Academic Deans, Curriculum Office, Dual Credit, Financial Aid, Communications, Student and Enrollment Services, Human Resources, Institutional Research, Payroll, and Bursar's Office. The dates are set in accordance with the state mandated start dates and in consultation with local independent school districts (ISDs). The Academic Calendar was sent forward from the committee to the Executive Leadership Team to the Academic, Governance, and Strategic Planning Council (AGS), who approved the recommendations.

In previous years, the Board has traditionally approved one academic year at a time. In order to facilitate cooperation with our local ISD partners over academic year alignments, we are proposing approval by the Board of the next two academic years. This two-year potential approval and subsequent annual review of the second-year calendar will allow for greater planning opportunities. The Calendar Committee will also begin a five-year guide to share with ISDs as projected calendars. The guide will be published on our website with the designation that each year beyond the two-year approval is tentative until approved by the Board. This allows for future planning by faculty, staff, and community partners as well as allows for classes to be more strategically scheduled in advance.

Sabbatical Proposal for Kimberly C. Harris Professor of Music Sabbatical Leave Period: August 2023 – December 2023

Abstract

Evidence-based practices demonstrate that course design, rather than content, rules as "king" of instruction. When course design aligns all aspects of instruction with Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs), the resulting framework benefits students by allowing them to demonstrate mastery through a scaffolding of assessments and learning activities (McTighe and Wiggins, 2012). According to recent literature, textbook costs are rising at a rate four times that of inflation and approximately only 30% of students purchase required course textbooks (Hilton, 2016). Currently, no resources exist that are both free for the Collin College Music Appreciation students that also align with the Collin College and State of Texas required SLOs including the Core Objectives: Teamwork, Communication Skills, Critical Thinking, and Social Responsibility.

My sabbatical plan is to create a Music Appreciation Open Education Resource specifically aligned to the SLOs required by .Collin College and the State of Texas for the MUSI1306 Music Appreciation Core classes. Sets of clear and measurable unit level learning objectives with assessments and corresponding rubrics (including a set that can be partially co-developed with students) will be created using the backward design method. A set of learning activities that align with the assessments will also be created. Any faculty teaching the Music Appreciation courses will have the option to offer students this free resource that aligns with the required SLOs. Faculty will also have access to the aligned assessments and learning activities. I will also create a series of professional development videos associated with the resources. The deliverables from this sabbatical will increase student access, reduce student costs, and improve assessment of the SLOS for the MUSI1306 course. Thank you for your consideration.



Sabbatical Proposal for Rex Kare Professor of Art Sabbatical Leave Period: August 2023 – December 2023

Abstract

In art, portraiture, the rendering of likeness of the sitter, is a cornerstone of an artist's skill set. Regularly, to supplement drawing from a live model, it is common for students to draw from casts of sculptures, allowing them to focus on proportion, technique, and details that they may sometimes miss during a live limed session.

Traditionally, the sculptural forms that students would reference are casts of portraits from classical antiquity and reflect a specifically western European concept of beauty and proportion. As a product of academy training at the New York Academy of Art, I can attest to the need for a greater diversity of facial forms and features in the examples that I came across in its cast hall.

My intent for sabbatical begins with starting a collection of plaster casts of portrait sculptures for the Collin College Art Department, which will be accessible to all drawing and painting students specifically for this practice of learning to draw from observation. To start this, I propose to sculpt several busts in clay from live models during my time on sabbatical. The subsequent casts in plaster from these clay portraits and facial forms, as well as from a couple sculptures I completed previously, will be placed on display in the drawing studio in the Plano campus for use in exercises and assignments.

Secondly, and maybe more importantly, these portraits will begin to reflect the broad racial diversity that exist in our own diverse community, setting for our students a very inclusive and broad benchmark of concepts of beauty and proportion. I can only make so many in a limited amount of time, but my hope is that over time, more will be added.

Additionally, I will continue my involvement in online workshops regarding anatomical drawing and painting best practices, so that I can continue refining and updating the content of my courses and approach to teaching Life Drawing, and Painting at Collin College.



Sabbatical Proposal for Tonya McMillion Professor of Video Production Sabbatical Leave Period: August 2023 – December 2023

Abstract

As the Discipline Lead of the Video Production program, it is important to constantly update my knowledge of the entertainment and production industry. POLICY REWRITE

Purpose

The College District is committed to providing a fair, safe, and productive work environment where <u>grievancesemployee complaints</u> are <u>dealt_considered</u> with <u>sensitivelysensitivity</u> and <u>expeditiously-in a prompt manner.</u> The purpose of the College District's <u>grievancecomplaint</u> policy is to assist in resolving all workplace issues and problems. The College District believes the best way of maintaining employee job satisfaction and good working relationships is to follow a procedure for solving problems and <u>grievancescomplaints</u> as they arise.

In most situations, employees should <u>first</u> make every effort to attempt to resolve matters informally by meeting with the person or persons involved, or if that is not feasible, with the immediate supervisor of the person involved prior to accessing the formal complaint process. Exceptions may include cases involving allegations of unlawful harassment, whistleblower allegations, and other instances where it may be impractical to do so.

Freedom from Retaliation

The College District will not tolerate any form of retaliation against an employee who brings a complaint pursuant to this policy. [See DG]

Notice

College District employees and students are informed of this policy through a variety of meetings and publications, such as orientations, the student handbook, and the human resources website.

Definitions

The complainant is the person filing the complaint.

The respondent is the person or entity that the complaint is filed against.

<u>The A ResolutionAppeal</u> Review Panel (<u>RRPARP</u>) is a group of College District <u>administrators employees</u> appointed to <u>hearreview</u> complaints, <u>and recommendations</u>. Each <u>RRPARP</u> is generally composed of <u>three to five at least two</u> administrators.

The terms "complaint" and "grievance" have the same meaning and may be used interchangeably. either one full-time faculty or one full-time staff member depending on the type of complainant.

Complaint Types

A complaint or grievance may include:

 Concerns about an employee's wages, pay, job duties, schedule or hours worked, or conditions of the employee's

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work, including performance evaluations area or reviewsenvironment;

- Violations of College Districta specific Board policy;
- Specific allegations of unlawful discrimination or harassment based on the sex, race, color, religion, national origin, age, veteran's status, disability, genetic information, one or any othermore legally protected classificationclassifications [see DIAA and DIAB];
- 4. Specific allegations of unlawful discrimination or retaliation based on the exercise of legally protected rights;
- 5. Specific allegations of adverse personnel actions based on the employee's good faith report to an appropriate law enforcement authority of a violation of a law by the College District or a College District employee, i.e., whistle-blower complaints [see DG];
- 6. Complaints resulting from the termination of an at-will employee [see DDC];
- 7. Complaints Complaint by a faculty member arising from the recommendation for nonrenewal or termination of atheir faculty contract or by an employee arising from the termination of their contract of employment [see DMAA and DMAB];
- 8. Complaints concerning the withdrawal of consent to remain on campus [see GDA]; or
- Any other complaint brought by an employee against another employee, supervisor, manager, vendor, or the College District.

Information Regarding Specific Complaints

For more information on complaints regarding: When a complaint is submitted alleging the violation of Board policy, the employee will need to specify the name of the Board policy at issue. For more information please see the following policies:

- 1. Alleged discrimination/harassment/retaliation, including violations of Title IX or Section 504, see DAA.
- 2. Dismissal of term contract employees, see DMAA.
- 3. Nonrenewal of term contract employees, see DMAB.
- 4. A commissioned peace officer who is an employee of the

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College District, see CHA.

- 5. An employment preference for former foster children, see DC.
- 6. Alleged harassment, see DIAA and DIAB.
- 7. Alleged retaliation (Whistleblower), see DG and DH. Whistleblower complaints must be initially filed within the time period specified by law, regardless of the time period specified herein. Additional time lines for the employee and the College District to respond as set out in this policy may be shortened to allow the Board to make a final decision within 60 days of the initial complaint.

Time Limits and Deadline to Submit Complaint

Except in cases involving unlawful harassment, discrimination, or retaliation, the employee must submit their complaint within ten thirty (30) College District business days of the date: (1) the complainant was notified of the decision; (2) the complainant knew of the action that caused the complaint or concern; or (3) the complainant reasonably should have known of the action that caused the complaint or concern, whichever date is the earliest.

In cases involving unlawful harassment, discrimination, or retaliation, the employee must report the prohibited conduct as soon as possible after the alleged act or knowledge of the alleged act so that the College District can take appropriate action at the earliest possible stage. A delay in reporting may impair the College District's ability to investigate, gather evidence, and/or take corrective action as part of the complaint process.

Consolidation of Multiple Complaints

Where it is determined that two or more individual complaints are sufficiently similar in nature and remedy to permit resolution through one proceeding, such complaints may be consolidated at the discretion of the chief human resources officer.

Untimely Complaints

If a complaint form or appeal notice is not submitted on time, the complaint may be dismissed, with or without a hearing, and the complainant will be notified in writing. An employee may appeal the determination of timeliness. The appeal will be limited to the question of timeliness and not the underlying merits of the com-

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plaint. The appeal procedures will be provided in the notice of dismissal.

Complaint Process Timelines and Extensions of TimeTimes

Any time limits set by these procedures, other than the time line for the initial filing of the After a complaint, has been submitted under this policy, all subsequent deadlines may be extended by the manager, of HR/employee relations for extenuating and unforeseeable circumstances.

Recordkeeping / Confidentiality

Employee complaints are kept separately from the employee's personnel file, in accordance with the College District's records retention policy. Complaint records are confidential to the extent permitted by law. Limited disclosures may be necessary in order to conduct a thorough investigation. Additionally, information may be disclosed in response to a subpoena or as otherwise may be required by law.

Recording Meetings

Meetings held with the RRP are recorded by the College District. A complainant, respondent, or witness whose interview is recorded may request a copy of the recording of his or her interview. Release of records will be in compliance with the Texas Public Information Act.

The College District will protect the individuals' privacy in a complaint filed under this policy to the extent that it is practical and allowed by law and College District policy. However, there may be times when disclosure of information is required in order to process or investigate a complaint. In all cases, efforts will be made to protect the privacy of individuals.

Representative

The complainant may designate a representative, including an attorney at the complainant's own cost, to represent him or herthe complainant at any level of the process by notifying the manager, employee relations of HR/employee relations in writing.

If necessary, the College District may reschedule any meetings to include the College District's counsel. Each party will pay its own <u>fees and</u> costs incurred <u>by representatives</u> in the course of the complaint process.

Neutral Third Party

Depending on the complexity of a matter or an unanticipated conflictand at the sole discretion of interest the chief employee success officer or designee, a neutral third party may be designated to hear and/or investigate a complaint or review an ap-

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peal if deemed necessary by the chief <u>human resources_em-ployee success_officer_or_designee.</u>

General Complaint Procedure

Detailed The College will implement procedures to resolve employee complaints. These procedures are not legal proceedings, but rather internal College District administrative processes to resolve workplace concerns amicably and at the earliest time period possible. The detailed procedures may be obtained from the human resources department.manager, HR/ employee -relations or at http://www.collin.edu/hr/complaints/Employee Complaints.html. The general complaint procedures are as follows.

Informal Process Step 1

Generally, employees area complainant is expected to attempt to resolve matters informally by meeting with the person or persons involved, or if to address the concerns. If that is not feasible, a complainant is encouraged to meet with the immediate supervisor of the person involved. human resources consultant assigned to their campus and the appropriate supervisors as determined by the human resources consultant.

Note:

Attempting to resolve matters informally concerning complaints involving any form of unlawful harassment, whistleblower allegations, and cases where it is impractical to do so is not required, and employees may proceed to Step 2.) 1.

Step 2 Formal Process

Step 1

If it is not possible to resolve a matter informally, a formal complaint may be submitted to the Human Resources Department by using the College District's online complaint form-or. Alternatively, a formal complaint may be submitted via hand-delivery to the manager, employee relations during regular business hours. Except in cases involving unlawful harassment, discrimination, or retaliation, the employee must submit his or her complaint within ten business days of the date the complainant knew or reasonably should have known of the action that caused the concern. In cases involving unlawful harassment, discrimination, or retaliation, the employee must report the prohibited conduct as soon as possible after the alleged act or knowledge of the alleged act so that the College District can take appropriate action at the earliest possible stage. A

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delay in reporting may impair the College District's ability to investigate, gather evidence, and/or take corrective action.

The <u>employee complaint form</u>¹ can be accessed on the College District's website.

If the complainant needs a reasonable accommodation in order to communicate his or her<u>submit their</u> complaint, the individual may contact the chief human resources officer manager, employee relations for assistance.

The complaint will describe all incident(s) at issue. Complaints will, reference violations of specific Board policy, if any, identify any relevant dates or witnesses and, provide sufficient factual detail to support the alleged violations, and indicate the dates of informal resolution conferences, if any.

Step 2

Upon an initial review of the complaint, the chief human resources officer manager, employee relations will determine whether the allegations, if proven, could constitute prohibited conduct as defined by this Board policy or applicable law. If the allegations do not rise to the level of prohibited or unlawful conduct, the complaint will be dismissed. Otherwise, the complaint will be referred to the next step under this policy. Any appeal will be limited to a determination of whether the complaint falls within the purview of this policy.

Step 3

A meeting with the RRP will be scheduled to provide the complainant with the opportunity to present his or her concerns. Barring unforeseeable circumstances or difficulty with scheduling, the meeting will be scheduled within ten business days of receipt of the complaint. After meeting with the complainant, members of the RRP will undertake an investigation appropriate to the circumstances to reach a determination of the complaint.

A meeting with the appropriate campus provost or senior administrator (generally the vice president of the respondent party) will be scheduled. The respondent will also receive a copy of the complaint and be asked to provide a written response that will be shared with the RRP for review.campus provost or senior administrator for review. At

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their discretion or in cases of a conflict, the campus provost or senior administrator may delegate the handling of the complaint under this step to the appropriate dean or administrator.

The College District will make reasonable attempts to schedule conferences at a mutually agreeable time. If the individual fails to appear at a scheduled conference without a compelling reason, the complaint will be considered withdrawn.

In most cases, the RRPcampus provost or senior administrator, or a designee, will issue a written summary determination within ten (10) College District business days of completing all meetings related to the complaint and recommend granting or denying each request for relief. If an extension is necessary, the complainant will be notified in the complaint. As partwriting of the extension.

its if either the complainant or the respondent disagrees with the decision at Step 3, the complainant or respondent may appeal the determination, the RRP to an ARP who will review the complaint file and issue a determination. An ARP is generally composed of at least two administrators and either one full-time faculty or one full-time staff member depending on the type of complainant.

The appeal must be submitted to the manager, employee relations within ten (10) College District business days of the date listed on the Step 3 decision. The manager, employee relations will confirm receipt of the appeal. The ARP may review additional documents, and if a majority of ARP members agree, may also, but is not required to, recommend alternative relief. conduct interviews of the complainant, the respondent, or witnesses.

The standard of review at this step will be by a preponderance of the evidence.

In most cases, the ARP will issue a written summary determination within ten (10) College District business days of completing all meetings related to the complaint. If an extension is necessary, the appealing party will be notified in writing of the extension.

In some cases, including those involving allegations of unlawful harassment, discrimination, or retaliation, the RRPARP may require additional time in which to conduct an investigation review information and prepare a determination. In such

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cases, the RRPARP will notify the complainant and respondent in writing how much time reasonably will be needed to conclude the investigation review and prepare a determination.

Step 3 for Determinations Related to Mid-Contract Termination

For those cases involving the recommended termination of a full-time contract employee during the term of the contract, and where the contract employee appeals the recommended termination, the meeting with the RRP will proceed as follows. The RRP will ensure that the College District/respondent provides specific notice of the basis for the proposed termination to

Step 5

If the complainant or the, if such notice has not been previously provided. Before the meeting scheduled with the RRP, the College District/respondent and the complainant will provide to each other and the members of the RRP a list of witnesses they may present at the meeting, along with a general description of the nature of their testimonies and documents that they intend to use at the meeting with the RRP.

Both parties will have the right to present witnesses and documentary evidence and to cross-examine witnesses presented by the other party subject to the guidelines imposed by the RRP. The RRP will provide to both the College District/respondent and the complainant the procedures for the meeting including any time restraints placed on the parties' presentations, as well as when each party will be required to provide exhibits and a witness list to the other party and to the RRP, and any other procedures applicable to the meeting before the RRP. The RRP will make a record of the hearing, either by tape recording or by court reporter. The strict rules of evidence will not apply, although all evidence should be relevant. The College District/respondent has the burden of proof and will make its presentation first.

The College District will make reasonable attempts to schedule RRP meetings at a mutually agreeable time. If the individual fails to appear at a scheduled meeting, the College District may hold the meeting and issue a decision in the individual's absence.

Step 4

If either the College District/respondent or the complainant disagrees with the decision of the RRP, the College District/respondent or the complainant ARP at Step 4, either party may appeal the determination to the appropriate executive vice president (generally the vice president of the respondent party). Or designee. The appeal must be submitted to the appropriate vice president (or executive vice president or designee as noted below) manager, employee relations

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within ten (10) College District business days of the date of listed on the RRP's Step 4 decision. The statement of appeal must:

- 1. Identify all points of disagreement with the determination;
- 2. Contain sufficient detail to clarify the basis of the appeal; and
- 3. Explain the reasons why the appeal should be granted.

 The standard of review at this step will be by a preponderance of the evidence.

The standard of review at this step will be by a preponderance of the evidence. If neither party files a timely appeal, the determination of the RRPARP becomes final and is nonappealable.

Note: For those complaints that involve the termination or non-renewal of a full-time contract, the appeal of the RRP's determination will be reviewed by the executive vice president or designee. The standard of review at this step will also be by a prependerance of the evidence.

Within ten (10) College District business days of receipt of the appeal, the vice president (or executive vice president (or designee as noted above) will issue a written decision affirming, affirming in part/denying in part, or reversing the RRP's ARP's determination.

The decision of the <u>executive</u> vice president or <u>designee executive vice president</u> is final and non-appealable for all types of complaints, except <u>for</u> complaints regarding the recommendation for <u>mid-contract</u> termination of a full-time <u>faculty member under DMAA(LOCAL)</u> or of a contract employee. <u>Those types of complaints may proceed to Step 6.</u>

Appeals to the District President and Board For those complaints that involve the recommendation of a faculty member under DMAA(LOCAL) the recommendation for a mid-contract termination of a full-time faculty member or of a contract employee only, the decision of the executive vice president or designee may be appealed to the District President and Board.

Nothing in this policy precludes an employee who has exhausted the procedures in this policy from addressing the Board of Trustees at the next regular public meeting in accordance with the provision for hearing of citizens. The Board is not required to take any action concerning a grievance but will listen to the employee's concerns.

Only complaints involving the termination of a full-time contract employee may be appealed to the District President and Board. If the College District/respondent or If-the complainant disagrees with the decision of the executive vice president or designee, either party the faculty member or contract employee may appeal to the Board by notifying the managermanager, of HR/employee relations within ten (10) College District business days of the receipt of the executive vice president or designee's Step 5 decision. The manager, employee relations will confirm receipt of the appeal.

Prior to placing the matter on the Board agenda, the District President will review the record. If the District President reverses the termination decision of the executive vice president or designee, the recommendation for termination of the full-time contract employee will be vacated, and the College District/respondent and the complainant will be notified in writing of the District President's findings and related actions regarding the matter. In this case, the matter will not proceed to presentation to the Board.

If the District President affirms the decision of the executive vice president or designee to terminate the full-time contract, the matter will be placed on the agenda for presentation to the Board. In such cases, the matter will be placed on the Board agenda after review by the District President, providing at least ten (10) College District business days' advance written notice to the complainant.

The complainant will be notified in writing of the date, time, and place of the Board meeting at which the complainant or representative will present his or hertheir concerns to the Board. The notice will include all applicable procedures for

the presentation. to the Board. The presentation will take place in closed meeting unless the complainant requests that it be heard in public. The Board may place time limits on the presentation.

The Board will consider the complaint, the record created at the meeting before the RRPcomplaint file maintained by the manager, employee relations, and the oral presentations to the Board and.

The Board may give notice of its decision orally or in writing at any time up to and including the next regularly scheduled Board meeting after the Board hears the matter. -However, the Board is not required to take any action. -If for any reason the Board does not take any action by the end of the next regularly scheduled meeting, the lack of a response by the Board upholds the last prior administrative decision.

Public Comment to the Board

Nothing in this policy precludes an employee who has exhausted the procedures in this policy from addressing the Board of Trustees at the next regular public meeting in accordance with the provision for hearing of citizens. The Board is not required to take any action concerning a grievance but will listen to the employee's concerns.

- 5. The name may honor any member or former member of the Board of Trustees who has served a minimum of 12 years (two full terms) on the Board of Trustees and or who was named to the Foundation's President's Circle.

Use of Auxiliary Revenue

The College District shallwill have the authority to utilize undedicated auxiliary funds to provide scholarships for students when it is determined that the scholarships have a public purpose and will serve the public's interests.

Public Purpose and Public Interests
Defined

The College District's service area has a demonstrated public need for trained and learned individuals in the health sciences and public services areas to provide nursing, emergency medical services, respiratory care, dental hygiene, fire sciences, police services, and other similar programs. In addition, the College District's business science and technology program areas also serve the public's interests by providing trained and learned individuals to meet the hiring needs of local employers.

Process

The College District shallwill have the authority to budget for and subsequently provide scholarships consistent with the public's interests with funds derived each year from auxiliary enterprises of the College District.

The Collin College Foundation shallwill be the administrator and shallwill identify the scholarship recipients from eligible candidates that meet the definition above. The ffoundation shallwill prepare and submit a report to the College District President listing all awards by donor and recipients, and the report shallwill be shared with the Board annually.

Note:

Scholarship funds shallwill not be allocated to a student who withdraws or is no longer enrolled at the College District.

Disclosure General Standard

An employee will disclose to his or her immediate supervisor a personal financial interest, a business interest, or any other obligation or relationship that in any way creates a potential conflict of interest with the proper discharge of assigned duties and responsibilities or with the best interest of the College District.

Specific Disclosures

Substantial Interest

The District President will file an affidavit with the Board Chair disclosing a substantial interest, as defined by Local Government Code 171.002, in any business or real property that the District President or any of his or her relatives in the first degree may have.

Any other employee who is in a position to affect a financial decision involving any business entity or real property in which the employee has a substantial interest as defined by Local Government Code 171.002 will file an affidavit with the District President; however, the employee will not be required to file an affidavit for the substantial interest of a relative.

Interest in Property

The District President will be required to file an affidavit disclosing interest in property in accordance with Government Code 553.002.

Gifts

An employee will not accept or solicit any gift, favor, service, or other benefit that could reasonably be construed to influence the employee's discharge of assigned duties and responsibilities. [See CAA and CAAB]

Endorsements

An employee will not recommend, endorse, or require students to purchase any product, material, or service in which the employee has a financial interest or that is sold by a company that employs or retains the employee during nonschool hours, unless the product, material, or service is recommended, endorsed, or required for a course the employee teaches and is reasonably related to the subject matter of the course and the course syllabus.

No employee will require students to purchase a specific brand of supplies if other brands are equal and suitable for the intended instructional purpose.

Sales

An employee will not use his or her position with the College District to attempt to sell products or services, unless the product or service is recommended, endorsed, or required for a course the employee teaches and is reasonably related to the subject matter of the course and the course syllabus.

Solicitation of Resources

The College District recognizes that appropriate gifts and grants of cash, equipment, real property, and other goods and effects are vital to the College District's growth and development and that seeking support from external sources is fully consistent with the College District's mission and purpose.

Through a letter of understanding between the College District and the Collin County Community College District Foundation, Inc., dated November 21, 1989, the Foundation has been charged with the rights and responsibilities of assisting the College District with the solicitation of external resources. The vice president of advancement or designee will serve as the official liaison with the Foundation to ensure coordination of all College District fundraising activities and objectives. On an annual basis—each March, the vice president of advancement or designee will provide a report to the Board of Trustees showing an account of all fundraising activities, major gifts, and other donations received during the prior fiscal year identifying major donors and corporate partners.

The Foundation has been designated as the official repository for gifts from the private sector that are donated to advance the College District's mission and purpose. Assets administered by the Foundation will be used exclusively for the benefit of the College District to include support for programs, employees, and students pursuing stated goals of the College District.

Grants and Other Sources of Funding

The College District's foundation office staff is responsible for soliciting and administering external funds for the College District. The foundation office staff also identifies, cultivates, and solicits grants and/or gifts from public and private agencies, individuals, corporations, and foundations. While each College District employee may, and should, play an important role in the process of expanding external support, such activities must be approved by the College District's Executive Leadership Team and be in compliance with College District procedures and guidelines. Foundation office staff will work with employees to create scholarship and excellence funds or to acquire other appropriate gifts.

Fundraising

Fundraising will mean any solicitation of any donation of anything of value from an external source by any officer, employee, agent, or volunteer acting on behalf of and for the benefit of the College District or any of its units or authorized affiliated organizations.

This policy will not apply to an employee(s) participating in duly authorized student activities, programs, or other approved College District activities. Duly authorized student activities are those activities approved in advance by the director of student activities. Approved College District activities are those activities approved in

Incompatible Positions

The Texas Constitution prohibits the simultaneous holding of more than one civil office of emolument [see DBD(LEGAL)]. Consistent with Texas law, College District employees may run for elected office to serve on the Board or other elected positions. Since Board members as public officials must avoid a position where private pecuniary interests or self-employment may conflict with the full exercise of public duties, if a College District employee is elected or appointed to the Board, the employee must relinquish the incompatible position that pays the employee a salary. Similarly, a Board member may not accept employment with the College District until the first anniversary of the date the Board member's membership on the Board ends [see DC(LEGAL)].

Student Housing rental fees. An increase in rent is necessary to support the Student Housing program and provide additional amenities to support student success. This proposal would increase the rent for each of our housing options by 4% per residency term option. This recommended increase is in response to the increase in mandatory fees associated with utilities and insurance.

The chart below outlines the current and proposed fees. Rent will be charged on a semester basis similar to other colleges (4.5 months). The average rent per month will be \$87-\$146 per semester more than the current rate, depending on the unit size and number of bedrooms, during the fall and spring semesters, and \$68-\$114 for a

full summer.

The District President recommends approval of the Student Housing fee increases effective for 2023-2024 in the amount equivalent to 4% per residency term option.

ADMINISTRATION RECOMMENDATION/REPORT

The District President recommends the Board of Trustees approves a contract for a Continuing Education Registration System from Modern Campus for the Technology Services Department.

BACKGROUND

The Continuing Education Department is seeking to replace its legacy, and soon to be unsupported, course registration application. The Modern Campus solution, called Destiny One, will provide an improved user experience for registering for CE courses. Modern Campus is also a Workday preferred partner for CE registration. The Destiny One application will facilitate user registration and provide a "shopping cart" experience for continuing education/workforce development registration.

Request For Proposal (RFP) Number 4533 was issued to procure a Continuing Education Registration System. One response was received. The response submitted by Modern Campus was evaluated by a team consisting of staff from Technology Services, Academic Affairs/Workforce Development, and VP Provost – Technical Campus. The proposal submitted by Modern Campus is being recommended as the best value to the District.

IMPACT OF THIS ACTION

This online registration software system for the College will replace the current registration system which will no longer be supported after September 2024. The use of this registration system will allow flexibility for Continuing Education to improve the ease of registration and provide integrated services with Workday.

BUDGET INFORMATION (INCLUDING ANY STAFFING IMPLICATIONS)

This purchasing request is for spend authorization of \$877,877 for five (5) years. Year one (1) will be funded from the Workday project budget (\$248,688) and years 2-5 will be funded from the Continuing Education operating budgets (\$639,189), pending Board approval.

MONITORING AND REPORTING TIMELINE

The contract term is April 1, 2023 through March 31, 2028.





Reversing the Slide

In 2022, Graduating HS Seniors in our service area were eligible for up to 7 credit hours of summer tuition through a program called Reversing the Slide. Paid by Collin College's CARES funding, the unique program offered multiple benefits to our students and the community.

Reversing the Slide Outcomes

- 1,300 students took advantage almost doubling the FTF enrollment from the previous summer
- Provides Collin College with multiple new Success Point funding opportunities
 - Reverse Transfers
 - Completion of Math, Reading and Writing Requirements
 - Crossing 15-hour and 30-hour ranges
 - 12 students completed their Core, an academic certificate or associate degree that summer
 - Transfer credits (Dual credit students don't count but First-Time Freshmen do)
- ISD partners shared with us that it increased their College, Career and Military Readiness (CCMR) points

Reversing the Slide Outcomes

- 260 students only took these courses (i.e. no prior dual credit and no enrollment in fall 2022)
- 511 students previously had dual credit plus this summer but did not continue on at Collin College in Fall 2022
 - Considered new credit hours due to the program
- Collin College would now be eligible for potential transfer success points on these students

Collin College Police Department Racial Profiling Report 2022

Article 2.132-2.134 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure (CCP) requires the annual reporting to the local governing body of data collected on motor vehicle stops in which a ticket, citation, or warning was issued and arrests made as a result of those stops, in addition to data collection and reporting requirements. Article 2.134 of the CCP directs that "a comparative analysis of the information compiled under 2.133" be conducted, with specific attention to the below areas:

- 1. Evaluate and compare **the number of motor vehicle stops**, within the applicable jurisdiction, of persons who are recognized as racial or ethnic minorities and persons who are not recognized as racial or ethnic minorities;
- 2. Examine the **disposition of motor vehicle stops** made by officers employed by the agency, categorized according to the race or ethnicity of affected persons, as appropriate, including any searches resulting from stops within the applicable jurisdiction;
- 3. Evaluate and compare **the number of searches** resulting from motor vehicle stops within the applicable jurisdiction and whether contraband or other evidence was discovered in the course of those searches; and
- 4. Information relating to each complaint filed with the agency alleging that a peace officer employed by the agency has engaged in racial profiling.

The analysis of material and data from the Collin College Police Department from 2022 revealed the following:

How high? How long?

Markets are coming to grips with the idea that the Fed is going to keep moving rates higher until they get inflation under control. The overall modest growth of the economy, tight labor markets and a resilient consumer added to the stubbornly high inflation is showing the Fed that more hikes are not only appropriate but may be necessary to reinstate price stability.


In fact, this month's uptick in economic strength may convince some FOMC voting members that the pace of rate ascent should also re-accelerate. Having come to the inflation fight late they are unlikely to leave too early. There is another meeting in March.


From the Fed's perspective these indicators are showing a modest but steady economy which means that the consumer and business can withstand significantly higher rates.

The economy, as measured by the GDP, has had its fits and starts. The Q4 report showed slowing but the consumer keeps consuming. That consumer activity however is coming from credit card use, maxed out savings and no anticipation of further fiscal stimulus which must eventually reduce the spending.

Real durable goods, a major economic index, dropped measurably in January, the largest drop since April of 2020. While headline orders continue to disappoint underlying the numbers suggest that business investment has improved however giving the Fed more wiggle room to increase rates.

Manufacturing in general has taken the brunt of the hit as consumers not only cut back, but also increasingly shift from goods to services expenditures. The service industry has − as a broader trend − also seen a sizable reduction in activity this year. The picture is hazy and it will require time to find the trajector ?.19






Stubborn Inflation vs Price Stability



The CPI and PPI clearly remain stubbornly high — especially the PPI. While there is improvement from last month the rate of improvement has slowed, falling short of expectations. The Fed's favorite inflation indicator the PCE (up 0.6%) has reversed its recent downward trend. The Fed needs to slow inflation from peak levels but also assure a continuation of decline back down to a more palatable and sustainable level at the Fed's 2% target. For the Fed, halfway won't cut it. Year-over-year, core inflation increased 4.7% from 4.6% last month.

Energy price concerns are once again taking center stage (along with eggs!). Reacting to global sanctions Moscow is cutting production and raising rates. Thanks to a warmer than usual winter this has saved Europe somewhat. Crude prices pose a sizeable risk to European economies (our trading partners) many of which are teetering on the brink of recession. In the EU, CPI rose 8.6% in January following a 9.2% in December. In the UK inflation is now 10.1% and is likely to continue driving those central banks to higher rates also.

Globally, China is another factor on the road to higher rates. The Chinese government appears to be taking control over exports especially in tech areas and those decisions will be at least partially driven by geo-politics which may raise prices. 


The Fed further moderated their pace of rate hikes, giving us only a 0.25% hike on February 2.

The Fed fully concedes that higher rates will slow growth but is willing to take these actions to tame inflation through lessening demand.

Continued inflation within a modestly strong economy may allow the Fed to re-invigorate their hikes however.

There are signs of slightly slowing inflation such as lower rents and a reduced need for workers. Housing however continues to slow amid high mortgage rates. Strapped consumers are struggling not only to make every day nondiscretionary purchases, but also certainly large ticket purchases such as a home. Low home inventory will not allow prices to drop any real degree.





How high? How long?

Markets are coming to grips with the idea that the Fed is going to keep moving rates higher until they get inflation under control. The overall modest growth of the economy, tight labor markets and a resilient consumer added to the stubbornly high inflation is showing the Fed that more hikes are not only appropriate but may be necessary to reinstate price stability.


In fact, this month's uptick in economic strength may convince some FOMC voting members that the pace of rate ascent should also re-accelerate. Having come to the inflation fight late they are unlikely to leave too early. There is another meeting in March.

From the Fed's perspective these indicators are showing a modest but steady economy which means that the consumer and business can withstand significantly higher rates.


The economy, as measured by the GDP, has had its fits and starts. The Q4 report showed slowing but the consumer keeps consuming. That consumer activity however is coming from credit card use, maxed out savings and no anticipation of further fiscal stimulus which must eventually reduce the spending.

Real durable goods, a major economic index, dropped measurably in January, the largest drop since April of 2020. While headline orders continue to disappoint underlying the numbers suggest that business investment has improved however giving the Fed more wiggle room to increase rates.

Manufacturing in general has taken the brunt of the hit as consumers not only cut back, but also increasingly shift from goods to services expenditures. The service industry has — as a broader trend — also seen a sizable reduction in activity this year. The picture is hazy and it will require time to find the trajectory.


Stubborn Inflation vs Price Stability




The CPI and PPI clearly remain stubbornly high — especially the PPI. While there is improvement from last month the rate of improvement has slowed, falling short of expectations. The Fed's favorite inflation indicator the PCE (up 0.6%) has reversed its recent downward trend. The Fed needs to slow inflation from peak levels but also assure a continuation of decline back down to a more palatable and sustainable level at the Fed's 2% target. For the Fed, halfway won't cut it. Year-over-year, core inflation increased 4.7% from 4.6% last month.

Energy price concerns are once again taking center stage (along with eggs!). Reacting to global sanctions Moscow is cutting production and raising rates. Thanks to a warmer than usual winter this has saved Europe somewhat. Crude prices pose a sizeable risk to European economies (our trading partners) many of which are teetering on the brink of recession. In the EU, CPI rose 8.6% in January following a 9.2% in December. In the UK inflation is now 10.1% and is likely to continue driving those central banks to higher rates also.

Globally, China is another factor on the road to higher rates. The Chinese government appears to be taking control over exports especially in tech areas and those decisions will be at least partially driven by geo-politics which may raise prices. At least some trade curtailments may help US manufacturers domestically.





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Expectations Drive Rates




The Fed further moderated their pace of rate hikes, giving us only a 0.25% hike on February 2.

The Fed fully concedes that higher rates will slow growth but is willing to take these actions to tame inflation through lessening demand.

Continued inflation within a modestly strong economy may allow the Fed to re-invigorate their hikes however.

There are signs of slightly slowing inflation such as lower rents and a reduced need for workers. Housing however continues to slow amid high mortgage rates. Strapped consumers are struggling not only to make every day nondiscretionary purchases, but also certainly large ticket purchases such as a home. Low home inventory will not allow prices to drop any real degree.






